"There are only two lasting bequests we can hope to give our children. One of these is roots, the other, wings." – Johann Wolfgang von Goethe

I read this quote today and found it very fitting for the end of another school year. It's always such a weird time of year. The children and teachers are excited to reach the end of a year and for many a summer break. Yet sometimes there are feelings of sadness surrounding saying goodbye to those we have become so attached to spending our days with. As I am personally looking at my child's last year at home next year, it is really resonating with me on a completely different level. So it made me think, how do we as parents and teachers insure that our children have the roots they need so that their wings can soar?

While looking at different resources, I found an article on the Harvard Health Publishing: Harvard Medical School, "Skills Children Need to Succeed in Life-Getting Youngsters Started". There are so many important ideas in this article.

How can we begin these skills at even the age of two? It begins with talking about planning and having your child be a part of it. We often as parents do all the planning and organizing and then just tell them what's happening. I love the idea hat when you are making plans for the weekend, dinner or holiday, that you involve your child in the process at even an early age. When we do our grocery shopping for the week, I always ask my children (now of course much older), do they have an idea for dinner one night. At their older age, we try to have them be in charge of completely cooking one night a week at least but at an early age, it could be as simple as having them help make the menu and then have them start

thinking about what you might need to buy at the store to make that happen.





Next, the article talks about focus. Focus is of course very hard for young children. We have talked a lot this year about being intentional about activities you do with your child and limiting screen time. So much research is constantly being completed that reiterates the need for limited screen time and how screen time is drastically effecting children's ability to focus. I can even see it in myself. I struggle now to just watch a movie or TV show with my family without feeling as if I need to scroll on my phone at the same time. All of our minds need that break. Show this to your child by picking up a book and turning off the screens. Help them retrain their brains.

The next skill is self- control. Also a skill that is just beginning to grow at preschool age. The best way we can help begin to develop this skill is in helping our children regulate their emotions independently. It's important to acknowledge their emotions but we need to help them learn to manage them. We can't always be there to fix what is upsetting to them but we can work to give them the skills to know how to handle life's challenges.

Awareness is the next idea they discuss. I love this idea. Being aware of those around us, our world and helping your child realize that while we love them and they are so important to you, that there are others in the world that need our help and support. That our planet needs us to care for it. That we play a critical role in the lives of those around us. This helps teach empathy and responsibility.

Finally, the last topic they discuss is flexibility. This is probably one of the hardest ideas of being successful in life. As humans, we all want things to go our way and done our way but that isn't life. Sometimes, your schedule doesn't go as planned and we have to be able to adjust either our plan or our emotions and move forward. We are all such creatures of habit that these changes are hard and if we struggle with it as adults, imagine how hard that is for our children. The best way to begin to help our children work toward this goal is by modeling for them how we are handling our own challenges.

I know that WEE are all working hard to help our children have the roots needs so that one day they can soar in all of the ways they are meant to soar. I can't wait to see what is next for each of our young friends. If this is a goodbye for your family from WEE, please keep in touch. We love to hear how you all are doing!

While we can't believe that this is our final newsletter of this school year, we are extremely grateful to have the rest of May, and part of June together, as we still have lots of fun learning left to do! We will be focus on vowels, their job in words, and review the 2 sounds each make, as well as the "th", "sh", and "ch" sounds. We will also review the other letters over the next weeks, with recognition, sound, and proper formation. We will also continue with our weekly/biweekly reader booklets.

We will continue work with rhyming words, and build on making/reading simple 3 letter c-v-c (consonant/vowel/consonant) words (cat, bat, sit, bit, bed, red...). We will continue to work on our ABBC pattern, as well as review all the others we've worked on. We will recognize and order #'s 0-20, practice skip counting, and focus on positional words. We will do simple measurement with rulers too.

Our door tags will remain the phone number that you provided, and the children will work on recognition and memorization. In another week or so, we begin each morning with a new prayer, as well as a new snack/lunch prayer until the end of the year. Our patriotic song has been "God Bless America", but in June, we'll go back to our September song "We Love America". We will continue learning about baby animals, as well as Maryland, the USA, and summer!

We could not be prouder of your children... in their individual growth, their gained independence, and in their accomplishments. They have gained confidence, curiosity, and determination. It has been our great pleasure to have them in our class this year to nurture and help grow. We will miss them each tremendously.

We have had so much fun learning in Science this year! Your children are amazing, natural scientists! They have observed, documented, guessed, hypothesized, and explored lots of things! We have experimented; some worked and some didn't. It was awesome when they worked, but it was still exciting when they didn't! We have seen and used different tools used by scientists (the 2's and 3's) have become comfortable with pipettes, mixing and using lots of Science tools. We have used many of our vocabulary words in other appropriate situations (liquid for example, a friend asked if I would pour him some more liquid at snack). Pre-K has grown so much in their observation skills! They have become so amazingly proficient in documenting our experiments through drawing. When their Science journals come home in June, look at the growth from September to the end of school. They are seeing the big picture with great detail! I am so proud of them! They have worked so hard and it shows!

As we end the year we will be making Seed balls from homemade paper. We will catch bubbles and The Lego Lady will hopefully make an appearance!

All of the children have made connections to their every-growing world. My goal is always that they realize science is an exciting way to learn things about the world around them and that sometimes things work and sometimes they do not. We just keep trying to figure it out. also hope that the children have grown in the confidence that there are very few problems that we cannot solve or at least manage if we just take a breath and think for a minute. We have also learned the mantra if we make a mess.... We can clean it up. And your children of all ages can clean up a spill themselves! It has been my joy to share my time with your children in science! They always remind me that God is amazing, and his creation is remarkable and often mind-blowing. To see the world through their excited eyes makes life so much fun! Please take time to look through their eyes, even when it is sometimes inconvenient. They are building their perspective of being a person by watching you. Do you literally stop and smell the roses? Do you unplug and turn bath time into a science experiment, a car ride into an adventure in the environment, cooking into research for the new thing I might like to try to eat. A mess into an opportunity to solve a problem and have the family work together as a team?

Thank for sharing your amazing children! It has been a pleasure and a privilege to see the them grow and learn and play! Have the bestest summer ever and remember...SCIENCE ROCKS!
