It's hard to believe we have already completed one month of school. The children have done a fantastic job of getting accustomed to our school routines and structure. They are making friends and hearing laughter and seeing smiles in each classroom. Overall, this year's classes adjusted much more quickly than last years. I think part of this is coming out of the COVID world into a more normal routine of life. Of course, for some friends it may take a little longer for complete comfort but they know that we love and care for them when their family isn't with them during the day Many of our friends are adjusting to doing things more independently. This can be exciting for some children but for others, very scary. We want to encourage our friends to try things even when they seem hard or that they can't do it yet. Yet is a very important word. Yet just means we are still working on it and that is OK!

You can help your child be successful at school by encouraging them to try things at home. This will be different for each child. Some may be working on putting on shoes independently. Others may be potty training. We want to encourage you to take the time to let your child attempt to do this for themselves. WE know that as adults, we are often hurrying from one thing to the next, but it is incredibly important for the child to be included and involved in what is happening. This is how they learn best-by doing. If they have trouble, tell them it's okay, remind them there are things that you can't do yet or that are hard for you but that you keep trying. Take time to celebrate successes when they do things independently as well. While the process takes time, it is so rewarding to see their smiles when they have successes.

As we begin October, we have already felt a change in weather. We are loving the cooler temperatures and more outside time. Remember that it can still be cold in the morning and very warm at times in the afternoon. Layers are often the best solution during this transitional weather. Be sure to check the extra clothes in your child's backpack or cubby so that they are appropriate for the season.

Fall is a wonderful time to explore the areas around us. The Baltimore area has many fun places that can be enjoyed as a family. We encourage you to take walks outside and look for signs of fall. It is fun to visit a local farm and go apple picking or choose your pumpkin together if your family carves one for Halloween. We have attached some local farms that you could visit. Always check their websites for more information about visiting before you go.

RED Room

Your children are amazing! In the month of September your children learned new routines, met new friends in the classroom, and welcomed us as their new caregivers. Most of our friends have adjusted to their new learning experience. We have only a few tears in the classroom and they are gradually disappearing.

We started our year with a two week unit on "School Friends". We practiced learning to share, taking turns, and playing alongside others our age. We also worked on colors, numbers, and recognizing our names. We especially worked on the color "red" and counting to "three". As the year continues we will introduce shapes, patterns, etc. to build on out prior concepts. We will introduce these concepts by playing games individually and as a group. The last two weeks of September were spent on our "Farm" unit. We worked on the names and sounds of various farm animals, where they live on the farm, and how they help people. We also learned about some things that grow on the farm.

Each month we will introduce a new month song using the same tune. With each song the children will learn several "sign language" signals. Each week throughout the year the children will be having specials (Art with Ms. Carol, Science with Ms. Dawn, Music with Ms. Claire).

For our first week of October we will be talking about Pets. We will learn how to care for our pets and how they help us. We will even look at different types of pets too. For our second week of October we will review National Fire Safety Week. We will be learning about the jobs of fire fighters and how they help people. We will also talk about the equipment they use as well as their uniforms. We will learn the difference between "hard" (helmets) and "soft" (hats), "hot" (really just warm) and "cold" and learn how to create the color "orange" by mixing yellow and red paint together. Next we will explore the beautiful season of "Fall". We will learn what happens to the trees and nature in the Autumn as well as how the animals prepare for the season of winter. During this two week unit we will continue to work on our counting skills. Our last unit of the month will be on "Community Helpers". We will be learning about the various people in the neighborhood who help us, and we will talk about their special jobs. During this week we will also be celebrating our first in-house event, our "Fall Fun Fest". We will be doing several activities that week to welcome to season of Fall. More details will be coming out about the exciting week. We continue to look forward to continuing to teach your precious children and thank you for allowing us to be a part of their lives.

Hello Parents,

The Green Room friends have done a terrific job during the month of September. We have really enjoyed getting to know each other better, and making new friends, as well as getting reacquainted with friends from last school year. The children have become familiar with the daily routine, schedule, and classroom rules. In Pre-K, it can be exciting to be more independent and have more responsibilities, but it also takes some getting used to and adjusting.

Social Development: We have also been working on giving our friends some personal space. We call it "a personal bubble." Sometimes when we respect a friends' personal bubble, it can solve conflicts quickly. We have also been working on listening to the teacher, and following directions right away.

DoJo App: Remember that you may follow your child's progress with positive behavior by using the DoJo App. When your child earns ten points for positive behavior, they will get a prize from the prize box. We also send the daily WEE notes on the App, along with many photos.

Themes: During September, the children enjoyed All About Me, Families, Alphabet Activities, the 5 Senses, and Apples. The children especially enjoyed the nature walk with our magical binoculars and tasting and charting apples.

We have the following themes coming up in October. We will begin the month with a color theme. We will have activities about primary and secondary colors, and colors and our emotions. Then we will progress into a farm theme and focus on: farm animals, barns, crops, and tractors. The farm theme will lead us into a harvest/autumn theme about leaves, squirrels, and pumpkins.

Literacy: We will focus on the following letters (writing the letters correctly and the sounds the letters make): Ff, Ee, Hh, and Vv. The children will also identify initial sounds in words, action words, and rhyming words.

Math: The children will be learning more AB patterns on the calendar. We will also continue to work on the Ten Frame, (more information about this concept will be in the daily WEE notes). Another activity pre-k children enjoy is The Number Buddies. These special buddies help the children understand the different ways numbers are used in daily life.

We are learning to recognize our first names written on many different things in our room, did lots of creative play during center time, learned new finger plays/ songs/prayers, developed our classroom rules, and learned a lot about apples!

During October we will continue to focus on more letters. By emphasizing the beginning sounds of words (for example: lollipop, dog, milk, or flag) you can help your child make the connection. Our October letters are: "Ff", "Ee", "Hh", "Vv", and "Ww". We will enjoy studying fall, pumpkins, leaves, fire safety, and maybe community helpers. We will also take our first field trip in a very long time!

This is where they document what we did through drawing. This is one of the places we talk about thinking like a scientist. I ask them-did I have a dinosaur in the room... no. Did we have a garden in the room...no. But let's talk about what we did see while in science. They are amazing! Our 3's are using verbal documentation and learning vocabulary.

I strive to help the all the children know: It is fun to explore, observe and guess! It is amazing to see change and wonder what made it happen. It is fun to sometimes almost know why it happened. And it is a wonderful thing to have fun learning!!

It is ok to make a mess, but we all have to help clean them up.... with a good attitude. It is ok for something not to work, and we can learn lots from these events. I can work with a partner and we can do it well. We can have conversations that help us as we explore and observe and guess. (3's and 4's). I can document in my journal what we did, what we used and what I saw (4's). I can document what we did by describing it.

We are going to be studying liquids, gas and solids in October and then we will have some fun with magnets.

Play together lots, laugh together, and hug!

Music with Ms. Claire

The children are having so much fun learning songs about September and the beginning of Fall/ Autumn. We also had fun singing with numbers, the alphabet, and movement. We used scarves to dance, flags to march to Patriotic songs and seasonal props to enrich the songs of Fall. In October, we will continue songs of Fall as well as Halloween. Each month we will focus on a specific patriotic song and celebrating any holiday. Why do we teach Music? There are so many skills that are taught during this time: listening, following directions, and learning vocabulary (language); learning rhythm (sensory); improve coordination (physical); and increase memory (intellectual). Plus--IT'S FUN!

This is Ms. Claire's 39th year teaching and her 32nd year at the WEE Center. She has taught children from infancy to First Grade. Ms. Claire is an avid quilter and scrap booker. This year she also began serving on the Board of Directors for TARGET Community & Educational Services in Westminster, MD. Ms. Elise loves to travel, watch movies and read. Her favorite place to vacation is Bethany Beach. She loves to laugh and easily cracks herself up...you can hear her happy laugh all over the building. Elise says that the WEE Center "feels like home". She describes herself with one word "laughter".

**Something you might not know about Elise is that she volunteered in a Romanian orphanage in 1999 and 2000 and she went skydiving in 1997!



Driving in the Rodgers Forge neighborhood, there are some roads on which if there's a delivery being made or someone parking or even someone just opening their car door into the street, you have to stop and wait. There's just not room to get by.

So the other day I was stopped behind a woman getting out of her silver Honda Fit. An elderly woman who slowly shut her door and moved to the back of her car so I could get by. I was driving our silver Honda Fit so I pulled up next to her, smiled, and said, "Nice car." She didn't get it. Looked at her car confused. Looked back at me puzzled. Then noticed my car. Smiled. "Thank you!"

There are so many fundamental connections easy to make. Relatively meaningless. Doesn't require anything but some basic awareness—and initiative. But how potentially meaningful. How vitally important. Just to acknowledge connections. In a culture so focused on divisions and divisiveness.

And I am often too busy, too self-absorbed, but as a minister (actually just as a somewhat thoughtful human being), I wonder what it would be like for each of us to encourage more intentionality about such noticing and commenting. I suspect it would be part of something big ... something transformational.
